ABOUT ENCINA

Encina Wastewater Authority (Encina) is a publicly owned joint powers authority located in North San Diego County, and is comprised of six (6) Member Agencies: the City of Vista, the City of Carlsbad, the Buena Sanitation District, the Vallecitos Water District, the Leucadia Wastewater District, and the City of Encinitas. Founded in 1961, Encina protects public and environmental health by providing wastewater treatment for approximately 380,000 residents and industrial users in a 123-square mile area. These services are provided through the operation, maintenance and administration of the Encina Water Pollution Control Facility (EWPCF) located in Carlsbad. The EWPCF has a rated treatment capacity of 43.3 million gallons per day and releases treated wastewater through an ocean outfall that extends 1.5 miles into the Pacific Ocean. In addition, Encina operates remote pump stations and the Carlsbad Water Recycling Facility, owned by its Member Agencies.

Encina is a model of excellence and innovation. Encina was one of the first wastewater treatment plants in the nation to adopt a cogeneration model back in the 1980's, converting biogas to green energy, supplying up to 85% of the power necessary to operate the EWPCF. In addition, Encina was a pioneer in using beer waste to enhance biogas production. Encina is also a leader in resource recovery management, converting biosolids to high grade fertilizer utilizing heat dryer technology.

Encina is committed to adhering to the highest standards, while demonstrating fiscal responsibility and cost-effectiveness for its member agencies. We are a values-driven organization, run by a highly trained and dedicated workforce, and strive to not only meet, but to exceed, the expectations of the community we serve. This document guides the strategic direction of Encina and was developed with input from the Governing Board, Member Agency Managers, staff and other key stakeholders.
